



Information note for the processing of personal data for the purposes of carrying out the study “Development and evaluation of Zoī recommendation models for prevention purposes”

1. What is this study conducted by Zoī?

The study “**Development and evaluation of Zoī recommendation models for preventive purposes**” is part of the standardization of preventive medical practices, and ultimately, the democratization of preventive medicine. The aim of the study is to develop and evaluate the performance of Zoī biomarker crossing models, with a view to standardizing and improving the quality of medical practices in the field of preventive medicine.

The performance of this study presents, with regard to its purpose both, for Members, for healthcare professionals and for the healthcare system as a whole, a public interest character in the healthcare field (Articles 6.e. and 9.2.i of the RGPD).

The study complies with deliberation no. 2018-155 of May 3, 2018 approving the reference methodology relating to the processing of personal data implemented in the context of research not involving the human person, studies and evaluations in the field of health (MR-004).

2. Who carries out the study?

The data controller for this study, i.e. the organization that decided to carry it out and is legally responsible for it, is Zoī SAS. 3. What data about me will be used in the study? Where does it come from and how long will it be kept?

The data that will be used for the study comes in particular from the completion of the Prevention Assessment and the use of the Services, and from the Application of **only those members who have completed their Prevention Assessments from November 2023 onwards**. Indeed, when you use these Services, data concerning you is collected if you have given your consent: it is this data that is necessary to carry out the study.

The categories of pseudonymized data collected are as follows:



- Health data from the medical questionnaire required for the Preventive Assessment;
- Clinical examination data;
- Biological data;
- Medical recommendations issued by your referring physician as part of your Preventive Assessment;
- Medical imaging data;
- Data from devices used during the assessment.

All these data will be kept by the data controller until the final study report is signed or published.

4. Who can access my personal data?

In accordance with the law, your pseudonymized personal data will be used exclusively by authorized Zoī personnel within the limits of their respective responsibilities. Only Zoī staff and any subcontractors directly involved in the research have access to the data, and only to that which is strictly necessary for their area of competence and expertise. These staff are bound by a strict obligation of confidentiality, and can under no circumstances identify you, as directly identifying data (such as your first and last names, or your date of birth) are excluded by nature from the scope of research projects.

In addition, your data is strictly secured, notably through encryption and pseudonymization mechanisms, to prevent unauthorized access and protect your identity. In order to comply with the articles of the French Public Health Code (article L.1111-8 du Code de la santé publique), Zoī uses the services of Amazon Web Services EMEA SARL as a certified health data host.

5. What are my rights with regard to the data concerning me used in this study?
